Why an Economic Development Strategy?


Purposes






Where Sturbridge Residents Work – the Industry Sectors




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INFLOW and OUTFLOW of WORKERS


- 4,380 people commute to Sturbridge for work

Top 10 Places Where Sturbridge Workers Live






- 41% commute over25 miles one-way

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Entrepreneurs & the Self-Employed

- Sturbridge has a significant number of self-employed persons and entrepreneurs
- Over 1,600 persons are selfemployed in Sturbridge & surrounding towns
- The self-employed in Sturbridge equate to over 10% of the work force



- In FY2019, Sturbridge collected:
 - \$1,082,908 in room taxes
 - \$481,991 in local option meals taxes
- Sturbridge ranks 1st amongst local towns as to both meals and room tax collections.
- Sturbridge ranks 40th amongst MA municipalities collecting room taxes
- Sturbridge ranks 78th statewide in meals tax collections

Leisure & Hospitality

- # 1 sector as to Jobs over past 15 years
 - 1,518 jobs in 2018
 - Hasn't recovered from pre-Great Recession high of 1,649 jobs
- # 1 sector as to Total Wages paid in 2018
 - \$33.7 million
- #2 sector as to number of businesses
- Generates Hotel & Meals taxes
 \$1.5+ million/year

- Number of establishments has declined 9.7% since 2015
- Average Weekly Wage is Low
 - \$424/week
 - \$22,204 annualized
- Employment can be seasonal



Manufacturing

- Steady, Stable Sector
- Ranks 5th as to jobs in 2018
 - 504 jobs
- Ranks 2nd as to sector with highest overall payroll
 - \$33.3 Million in 2018
- Ranks 3rd as to highest weekly wages in 2018
 - \$1,271 avg weekly wage
 - \$64,821 annualized wages

- Sturbridge Manufacturers:
 - Metal Wire Manufacturers
 - Fiberoptic/Photonics
 Manufacturers
- <u>Growth Industry</u> per Southern Worcester County CEDS – Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy
- Priority Industry is Advanced Manufacturing in Hampden Co.

Professional & Technical Services

- One of Top 5 Sectors Locally
 - # 4 in 2018
 - 41 Establishments
- Ranked # 5 in 2018 as to overall payroll
 - \$22.1 Million

- Growing Sector
 - # of Establishments
 - Overall Payroll
 - 219 persons employed in 2018
 - Growth sector for Southern Worcester County CEDS
 - Critical Industry for Central Mass WDA

Business Sectors: Retail













Retail

- Establishments decreased from 66 to 47
 - 29% decrease
 - Large drop in businesses
 - since 2015
- Ranked # 2 as to persons employed in Sturbridge
 - 1,026 jobs in 2018
 - 19.3% of all local jobs
- Ranked # 4 as to overall payroll in 2018 -- \$24.7M

- Declining but Key Sector
- Online shopping disrupting retail
- Part of Visitor Experience
- Sturbridge has both large-scale
 & "Mom & Pop" retailers
- Low wages with seasonal work
 - \$463 Average Weekly Wage
 - \$24,076 annualized
- Critical Sector Central MA WDA

Health Care & Social Assistance

- Ranked # 1 as to Establishments in 2018
 - 63 Establishments
 - 125% Growth in 15 years
- 4th Largest Sector as to Jobs -- 524 jobs in 2018
- Growth Sector for Southern Worcester CEDS
- Priority Sector for Central Mass WDA


Growth Drivers:

- Aging Population
- Interest in Wellness & Fitness
- Sturbridge population are high health users

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- 24.9% under 18 years
- 17.4% over 65 years

Business Sectors: Logistics











Logistics

Growing Sector:

- E-commerce
- Desire for same-day and just-in-time deliveries
- High Demand for Warehousing Locations near population centers
- Trucking potential for disruption by AEVs

Sturbridge's Location:

- Excellent Highway Access
- Central location in MA and New England
- Lacks Rail and Aviation
- On the "frontier" of Boston region
- Few large sites in Sturbridge with easy, quick highway access





Sturbridge As A Place to Do Business




Resident Survey- Preliminary Findings Quality of Life in Past 3 Years




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Residents' Survey – Preliminary Findings Importance & Role of Business




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Residents' Survey – Preliminary Findings How Sturbridge Businesses Rate






How supportive is Sturbridge town government to local businesses?







Factors Important to My Business in Sturbridge



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Future Business Plans

Businesses Considering Expansion or Relocation

- 17% indicated they plan to expand or relocate
- 22% may possibly expand or relocate

Alert:

- 54.5% said they are considering Sturbridge
- 36.4% are considering Worcester County
- Only 21% of business have significant room to expand at current location

Intent to Add Employees in Next 3 Years

- 39% of businesses intend to hire and add staff
- 26% will possibly be hiring

Cautionary Warning:

- 46.2% find hiring middle skilled workers a problem or severe problem
- 28.5% find a problem/ severe problem hiring professional & managerial workers
