OVERVIEW

On 29 April the town hosted a charrette to discuss possible zoning updates to the Route 15 corridor. The charrette drew over fifty-five participants who actively took part in the exercises. In general, staff found the consensus amongst the participants that the zoning should remain as is for the time being was due to the limited and non-contiguous developable land in the corridor. While this did draw consensus, the group differed on whether the corridor should or should not have development. One group felt that the corridor should remain generally as is and maintained as a green corridor. The other believed that there is potential economic value in developing that land given its proximity to Route 84. Regardless of which group the participants belong to, it was recognized by most that the corridor's geography, hampered further by the lack of infrastructure, limits the opportunities for growth at this time.

PARTICIPANT RESPONSES

Following summaries of the corridor's zoning and of the most recent study of it, participants were asked to respond to a series of questions and present those findings to the group. Five questions were prepared but ultimately due to time and the participants responses, only two were asked. Staff felt confident that they had received the answers necessary for further actions. A complete record of the groups responses are attached for reference.

QUESTION 1: Focusing on Recreation and Entertainment types of uses...What current zoning uses should continue to be allowed in the corridor? What new uses, or categories of land uses, should be added to the zoning bylaw for this corridor?

¹ Staff believes this number is higher as it was noted a few participants did not sign in. All those who did sign in are listed in Attachment 1.

Participants, in general, fell into one of the two aforementioned visions for the corridor. Those that wish to maintain the green space support the concept of maintaining the existing zoning. The others who wish to see more development had suggested uses that ranged from small dog parks and athletic fields to expanded retail (such as Bass Pro shops) and entertainment venues (such as the Great Wolf Lodge). The key takeaway from this was that the group was divided as far as the question of whether or not to encourage development.

QUESTION 3: Based upon the list of potential new uses you developed in the last exercise consider this. If you could decide how to draw the corridor to show which areas would be affected by these changes, how would you draw it? What areas would/would not be affected and why did you choose them? Using a bold marker, draw on your maps the area you would like to be covered by the uses your group has developed.

For this question, the participants almost universally recognize the challenges with this corridor as there is little land on which development could occur. It was shown that there is approximately 153 acres of undeveloped land, some of which contains wetlands, and it is spread out throughout the corridor. There is little developable land that is left in the corridor. For this reason, the group almost universally acknowledged that given current circumstances it is difficult to develop this area and therefore offered little to no changes to the zoning in the corridor.

SUMMARY:

Given the opinions of the participants and the current corridor challenges, it is the opinion of staff that the zoning remain generally unchanged and that certain uses should be clarified. To that end, recommended updates to the zoning in Route 15 have been drafted and are being presented to the Board along with this charrette summary document.

The New York Road

The correct name for Old Route 15 is the New York Road. State designation was State Route 15.

When a new westbound I-84, (formerly I-86), was built, the westbound became the eastbound and the eastbound became a "Local access Road". This is the New York Road.

Haynes Street goes from Route 131 aka Main Street to just past the Publick House parking lot where it insects with State Route 15. This intersection is well defined.

Road name changes always went before a town meeting to vote the change.

The southbound lane is fenced from public access wherever it is bounded by I-84. That would be in the right hand side of the New York Road to the bridge by the truck stop where it crosses underneath, then on the left hand side to the end of the New York Road just before the Connecticut State Line.

From the Publick House rear access road Mr. Patel owns where his former motel was. Then the next 7 acres belongs to the Town of Sturbridge aka the Shepard property. Private property thence to River Road. From River Road to Kelly Road is the Yogi Bear campground with the gas pipeline access.

From Kelly Road the next is or was Galonek property to the property of the private condominiums. Thence to the former Roy Rogers property.

The west side from the bridge by the truck stop are I-84 ramps then private property to the junction with I-84 West.

So, we are being asked to re-zone very little private property for a POSSIBILITY someone wants to build a business on it. They have had that chance since the last rezoning of it.

My final point is, it is a distinct pleasure to travel that pristine road without the clutter of driveways and traffic as we do on Routes 20 and 131. I have traveled that road for the past 82 years and it has not really changed from being a quiet, peaceful road. Why do we need ruin a good thing on the possibility to have fast food restaurants, motels and the like on it? We have enough of both to serve us and tourists now.

And this new designation almost qualifies to be spot zoning. Last I knew spot zoning is frowned upon by the Commonwealth.
