 - Project was continued from the last hearing to allow for responses to the peer review and staff comments.
- Presentation and Discussion:
 - Revised plans show changes to the stormwater structures which have less impacts on the Riverfront.
 - The Agent recommends a site visit to visually see all the changes to the plan, Oxbow will join the Commission for a visit in March.
 - All work on adjacent properties for restoration of the Riverfront will require a separate filing.
 - Glenn Krevosky and Steve Bressette from the project team addressed some of the staff comments and Oxbow review report.
 - Agent would like further information on fencing for light blocking in the riverfront areas.
 - The Commission has concerns with the amount of disturbance in the riverfront area, as part of this review the applicant was reminded that all alternative parcels should be explored.
 - Applicant must fully demonstrate compliance with 321 CMR 10.58

7. DEP File # 300-929 70 Paradise Lane Reardon

<u>Presentation and Discussion:</u> An Order of Conditions was issued in 2015 for this project. After visiting the site with the owner it appears that they are not in compliance with the OOC. The Agent is working with Summit Engineering. They will work on creating a plan for the stormwater on site. The Commission wants a plan for the next meeting on March 10th to review.

- Trails Committee chair Brandon Goodwin has a request to use Leadmine property for an ice sculpture contest starting 2/15 (due to warm temps)

- B. Goodwin also updated the Commission on the Riverlands Trails expansion, the trail expansion requires two stream crossings.
- The Agent reminded the Trails Committee that all work within the 200ft buffer zones would require permitting not just the crossing.

- 128 hazardous trees near the handicap accessible trail need to come down do to disease. This covers .7 acres of land. The Commission is in favor of supporting the plan and have no additional comments for the Forester.
