Nothing says "fall" quite like apple picking – pick your bunch at Hyland Brewery & Orchard, a third-generation, family-owned farm situated on 150 acres of pristine land. Starting September 20th, the Orchard will open on weekends to the public for their annual fall festivities. Whether you prefer Granny Smiths, Cortlands, or good 'ol Macintosh, you can pick your perfect mix from over 2,000 apple trees. Bring a picnic to enjoy on the scenic lawn while you listen to live music, or jump on a hayride and pet the friendly barnyard animals. Craft beer fans should also stop by the Orchard's rustic 1940's apple barn, which houses the main brewing operations for local favorite: Rapscallion Beer. Rapscallion also operates an 18-hole disc golf course on the property, which visitors of *all* ages can enjoy.

The largest private zoo in New England, Southwick is well worth the 45-minute drive from Sturbridge. Forget red lights, chaotic merges and deer crossings – here you'll be driving past swarms of chattering Capuchin Monkeys while an African Lion roars over your radio. Take advantage of this unique, unprecedented opportunity to explore the region's premiere zoo without having to leave the comfort and safety of your own vehicle. For the full experience, you can download special tour guide audio from the zoo's website to play as you cruise past Bengal Tigers and through forests of Elk. Guaranteed to be your family's most unforgettable road trip, and the *only* one where your kids won't be asking: "Are we there yet?"

Note: The zoo is also open for regular walking visits every Tuesday and Thursday-Sunday, with standard COVID-19 precautions and sanitizing procedures in place. Per state requirements, all visitors (drive thru and walking) <u>must</u> purchase their tickets in advance for a specific date and time; tickets will not be sold at the entrance. Outside food, coolers, and large bags are not permitted in the zoo at this time. The zoo's 2020 season will run until October 31.
