Day 1

Soak Up American History at Sturbridge Common Historic District

Sturbridge was founded in 1738, situated along the old Boston Post Road. In the center of town, you'll find Joshua Hyde Library, the Federated Church and Sturbridge Town Hall. Across from the library you'll find the Old Burial Ground, a resting place for many Revolutionary War Veterans. And across from the cemetery is the Sturbridge Common. During the Revolution, the Common was active and served as the site where a cavalry company was raised and sent to serve with George Washington's Continental Army. Colonel Ebenezer Crafts, who was the founding Innkeeper of the Publick House Historic Inn, located across the street from the Common, personally raised and equipped the company.

A truly one-of-a-kind experience that you'll *only* find in Sturbridge, Massachusetts.

On-site Dining: *Historic Tap Room* – Step back in time at the inn's Historic Tap Room, where guests having been dining and socializing for centuries. This charming room still boasts its original hardwood floors and "post n' beam ceiling." But the real selling point is the gigantic, six-foot-long fireplace, whose open hearth will warm even the chilliest of travelers. Enjoy generous portions of traditional comfort food, like their roasted turkey dinner or Yankee Pot Roast.

Welcome Back Spring

Looking to reconnect with the great outdoors? There's no better time to go for a nature walk than springtime, when plants and animals alike are emerging from their winter slumber. Delight in hearing the cheerful calls of returning songbirds, as the first buds of the year poke through the ground and bloom into color. Whether you're a novice or an avid hiker, there's a trail in Sturbridge waiting for you.

❖ Wells State Park

There's a reason why Wells State Park is the most popular park in Sturbridge. With over 1,400 acres of oak-hickory forest and freshwater, there's something for every kind of nature lover! Explore its 12 miles of trail on foot, mountain bike, or horseback. Dip your toes in Walker Pond, which also offers kayaking, canoeing, an assortment of fishing, and a campers-only swimming beach. Be sure to visit Carpenter Rocks, whose summit boasts a scenic lookout over the surrounding forest.

Leadmine Mountain Conservation Area

A robust, multi-purpose area, Leadmine Mountain boasts five marked trails totaling 11 miles, spanning everything from oak and pine forest to submerged wetland. Visitors are invited to use the trails for hiking, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, horseback riding, and wildlife viewing (motorized vehicles are not allowed). The Raven Rookery Trail is an easy hike that takes you to an emerald lagoon. Fishing and hunting are also permitted on the property, so be sure to wear bright orange during the hunting season.

The Trustees' Tantiusques Reservation

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Tantiusques Reservation is an outdoor excursion and history lesson rolled into one. The reservation was once a great source of graphite and was mined for centuries by the native Nipmuc tribe and local English colonists until it was abandoned in the late 1800's. Today, hikers can still see an open mine shaft and partially-filled mine cut, the only remnants of New England's first-ever mining operation.
