BALLOT QUESTION

Shall this Town approve the charter amendments proposed by the June 5, 2023 Annual Town Meeting summarized below?

The Charter amendments approved under Article #46 at the June 5, 2023 Annual Town Meeting made both non-substantive and substantive changes to the Town Charter. The non-substantive changes include revisions to spelling, punctuation, grammar, internal consistency and form issues. The substantive changes include: Selectmen to Select Board, Change to the Annual Town Meeting from the 1st Monday in June to the 4th Monday in April, voting at Town Meeting will be by electronic devices or any form determined appropriate by the moderator. In the event that members of the Select Board are the subject of a recall, the members who are being subjected to recall will recuse themselves from the duties delineated in the recall process. If all members of the Select Board are subject to recall, then all duties required of the Select Board members in the recall process shall be performed by the Town Clerk, The Town Administrator and the Town Clerk shall inventory the Board and Committee list every 6 months to ensure that the lists are accurate and complete, Appointment of town employees except for the authority of the Town Administrator to recommend candidates for confirmation by the Select Board, the Town Administrator may delegate any and all parts of the search process. Except for the appointments of the sworn peace officers, EMT'S, and fire fighters to the police and fire departments, as applicable, No Select Board confirmation shall be required for the Town Administrator to appoint a candidate to any position that doesn't not hold the authority (1) to expend public funds; (2) hire or terminate; (3) review the work of others for purposes of promotion/demotion; or (4) determine compensation. Publication of the Charter and Bylaws shall be available within 90 days of the adoption.
