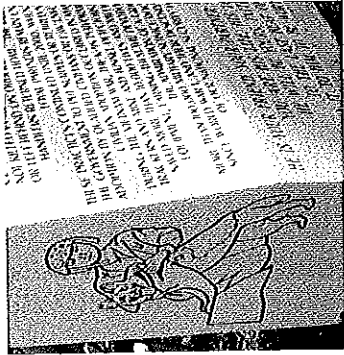


War Dog Monument

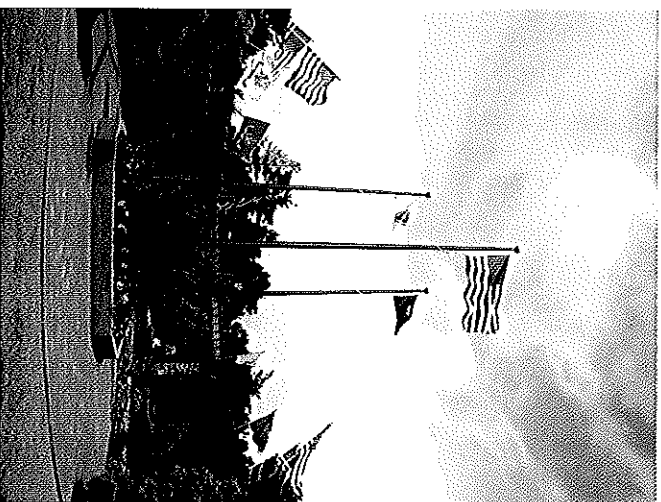

Place of Flags

As visitors approach the Massachusetts Vietnam Veterans Memorial, they first encounter the Place of Flags. This is a circular plaza surrounded by an arbor constructed out of California redwood. It features a central garden that hosts three flagpoles, on which fly the standards of the United States of America, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the POW/MIA flag. Inscribed on the granite retaining wall:

“Vietnam – 1955-1975.”



Place of Names

The Place of Names proclaims, in stone, the names of 1,546 Massachusetts men and 1 woman veteran who remain missing or who died in combat as a result of wounds received while in action in Vietnam. Forever more will those who visit this PLACE see the names of those who answered the call and remain forever young.



Place of Words

The Place of Words consists of an area where the words of veterans are etched in stone for all to see and contemplate. The writings in the PLACE OF WORDS are the text from letters written home by 13 Massachusetts servicemen who died in Vietnam. For veterans, Gold Star family members, and the citizens, this space is a place of knowledge, reflection, and understanding for those who gave their life for freedom.
