Re. 263 & 269 New Boston Road, Sturbridge – Non-Vernal Pool Study

Dear Commission,

As the photo exhibit array, which extends from 3/9/2022 to 5/1/2022, indicates, the 263 New Boston Road pool never contained water during our review period.

The 269 New Boston Road pool (photo exhibit from 2/20/2022 to 5/1/2022) is exceedingly shallow when it does contain water and had dried up by 5/1 – even though April 2022 had slightly above normal rainfall. This pool did not hold water for two continuous months during the spring when the water table is generally at its highest (this pool was also dry by the end of May 2021).

To conclude, due to the draining effect of the glacial outwash Hydrologic Soil Group A gravel pit located directly west of the site, the wetlands to the east of the gravel pit have been exceedingly drained to the point where they are reverting along their margins to a predominance of upland vegetation and any former pooling areas now do not contain enough water to support vernal pool inhabitants.

Prior to moving on the pool I waited for approximately 7 minutes to hear if there was any chorusing of Spring Peepers or Grey Tree Frogs, there were none.

We paused for 10 minutes to hear for chorusing, non was recorded. We then went to the pool and seined and found no Fairy Shrimp and no Wood Frog or Ambystoma egg masses.

We then went to the pool and seined and found no Fairy Shrimp and no Wood Frog or Ambystoma egg masses, but we did find mosquito larvae (third photo).


