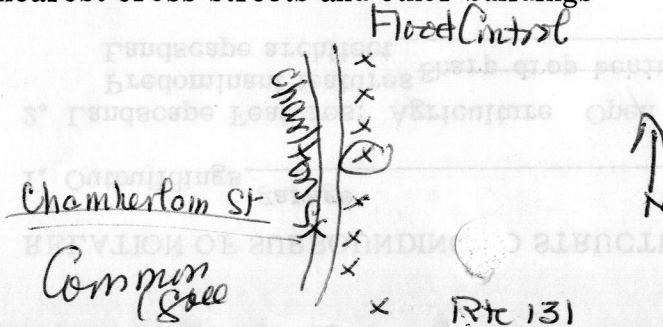

Arthur Plimpton, who had the house next south (now owned by V. Jackson; see Form 14) took the lumber and whatever else could be used when the Old Cement House on Holland Rd. was taken down and built this place which was soon afterwards bought by its present owner. This therefore is most recent of homes in the whole area of the Common, and it completes a row in the most modest section thereof.
